## **CONCEPT NOTE**

The ethnovisual approach in its new avatar 'ethno-graphy' is re/establishing its application rationale for exploring dynamic socio-ecological settings of diverse geographies. Combining qualitative research with visualization techniques, arts-based pedagogies are being widely appreciated and applied by interdisciplinary researchers in capturing and disseminating complex and vibrant socio-ecological narratives from the ground. As part of the Water and Development Partnership (IHE Delft, Netherlands) funded **AQUAMUSE** initiative and with a focus on the Sundarbans Delta, this workshop will expose participants to critical ethnovisual pedagogies, comprising theories, case studies, and hands on activities. The participants will engage in joint project presentations and the best project(s) would also entail possibilities to join AQUAMUSE as interns (for winter 2024-25).


#### **OBJECTIVES**
